

The story is centered on corporate "downsizer" Ryan Bingham (George Clooney) and his travels. Business reference: Human Resources, retrenchment



- 3. Look up some reviews about Banham Zoo see if you can find both positive and negative. From this, what are people suggesting are the strengths and also the weaknesses of the zoo?
- 4. Try to identify all the different activities (or at least some of the main ones) that you could do at Banham Zoo. You could try to do this as a montage of pictures/word cloud/spiderdiagram.
- 5. See if you can find out any plans for future development that the zoo currently has (bear in mind that this might very well change in the future)
- 6. What particular threats are the zoo facing at the moment (and how are they responding to these threats)
- 7. Have a look at other zoo websites and see what they do differently/better/not as well. You could set up a table (or spreadsheet) to compare the different zoos. Also look at other local competitors to the zoo (eg pleasurewood hills) and see if you can compare:
