Exercise During Exams

With the GCSE and A Level exams commencing very soon, it is important to remember that Public Health England recommends that children complete an average of 60 minutes of moderate or vigorous intensity exercise a day across the week. 


New trips, events and visits happen all the time. Where trips are over-subscribed, names are drawn at random. We try to give families as much time as we can for payments to be made,



YEAR 7 GEOGRAPHY

Students have been completing an investigation into how infiltration rates vary depending on the surface. In groups students had to devise a fair method to see how long it took for water to infiltrate a range of types of ground, including astroturf, gravel, hard soil and grass. Students then had to work out the mean time and present their findings in a graph, as well as thinking about the reasons for the varying rates in their analysis.















YEAR 10 GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK

It was the tale of two very different days for the year 10s who were completing fieldwork in Southwold. Those lucky enough to go on the first day had beautiful sunshine and plenty of tourists to complete their questionnaires, however those who went on the second day had wind, rain and a distinct lack of tourists to ask. Nevertheless all students collected a range of primary data that we are going to present and analyse back in the classroom in order to reach conclusions about the appropriateness and effectiveness of different coastal defences at Southwold.

To register, you need to:

create an account on the school website at www.hartismere.com/Account/Signup.

(You can skip this step if you have already registered.)
Ask your child to enter their username and password when prompted.

Most emails we send home are posted on our website, as well as updates, information, and announcements. New content is added to the website daily. To keep up with everything that is going on at Hartismere you can also follow us on Hartismere's official Facebook page and X.



BEGINNING AND END OF THE SCHOOL DAY

If parents are picking up and dropping off their children at school and in Eye, please could we ask that they are mindful of people in the local area? Local residents have experienced cars blocking driveways and other access points, including on the Castleton Grange estate. Please do park and drive with consideration for everyone in our community. There is no permission for use of the hospital car park for drop-offs or pick-ups. Disabled parking spaces are, of course, for people with mobility difficulties. Thank you for your support.

The Local Authority is responsible for arrangements concerning school buses and this is managed through the service <u>SuffolkOnBoard</u>. It is recommended that, where possible, pupils and students walk or cycle to school.

Please remember that students should only travel on the bus to and from school that is clearly identified on their bus pass, otherwise they risk causing overcrowding and other safety problems.
